Mitch Davis is currently the General Manager of Davis Family Dairies. He has worked in all areas of the family cheesemaking and spray drying business with emphasis in whey and whey fractions processing. He holds a BS in food science and nutrition from the University of Minnesota.

Paul Kononoff, a native of Saskatoon, Saskatchewan, Canada, received his PhD in dairy nutrition from The Pennsylvania State University. Paul is currently an Assistant Professor of dairy nutrition at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln. His research focuses on understanding the relationship between forage quality and ruminal fermentation in lactating dairy cows.

Rick Lundquist received his PhD in dairy nutrition from the University of Minnesota and is the owner of Lundquist & Associates, a nutrition and management consulting group established in 1985. Rick works with large dairies throughout the country from Florida to Arizona and the Upper Midwest. He currently resides in Duluth, MN and also has an office in Sarasota, FL.

Lloyd Metzger is currently an Associate Professor and Alfred Chair of Dairy Education at South Dakota State University. Lloyd is also the Director of the Midwest Dairy Foods Research Center and serves as Executive Secretary of the North Central Cheese Industry Association. He teaches undergraduate and graduate classes in the dairy science department and his research focuses on the relationship between protein structural characteristics and their functional role in dairy products.

Gary Neubauer, DVM, currently serves as Senior Veterinarian, Dairy Veterinary Operations for Pfizer Animal Health. Gary provides technical support and consultation for the Midwest focusing on milk quality, reproduction, fresh cow health, record analysis and residue avoidance. Previously, Gary served on the executive board of NMC and was a partner for 16 years in a 15-veterinarian practice based in New Ulm, MN. Gary received his DVM and undergraduate degrees from the University of Minnesota.

Jim Salfer is a Regional Extension Educator with the University of Minnesota Extension Service. His primary responsibility is to develop and implement educational programs to help improve the profitability of dairy producers throughout Central Minnesota. Jim is also involved in developing curricula and teaching classes on nutrition and dairy management. Jim earned his BS from South Dakota State University and MS from the University of Minnesota.

Leo Timms received his MS and PhD in Dairy Science from the University of Wisconsin and is currently an Associate Professor and Extension Dairy Specialist at Iowa State University. Leo teaches in the Animal Science Department and College of Veterinary Medicine. His research/extension efforts focus on milk quality and mastitis, reproduction, animal housing and comfort, and dairy records analysis.
